The goal of the Kansas Green Schools Program is to provide opportunities for preK-12 schools to increase awareness and understanding of the complex environmental interrelationships that impact public health and the environment, and promote environmental stewardship practices that relate to air quality, climate change, solid waste reduction and recycling, water management, and outdoor wildlife habitat.

School has been underway for awhile, and hopefully you are starting to implement ideas to make your school more green.

More than 100 educators take part in Kansas Green Schools Conference

Over 100 educators from Kansas and Oklahoma participated in the 2011 Kansas Green Schools Conference at Goddard High School in July. The keynote speaker, Dr. Herb Broda, wowed the group with low- and no cost ideas for using your schoolyard as a learning site. Dr. Broda was also very complimentary of all the great work Kansas Green Schools are doing!

More than 30 presenters from 17 Kansas Green Schools and partners held informative concurrent

sessions on topics ranging from school gardens to how to get started as a Green School. The new Kansas Green Schools Standards of Excellence were unveiled, and a new Garden Gate portal on the Kansas Green Schools website was demonstrated.

Description: There are several Do Something Grants offered to youth each week: 1) Seed Grants are offered to start a community action project or program or take an existing successful project/organization to the next level. \$500 each week. 2) Project Pitch Grants are offered to take

a project or organization to the next level with a strong pitch. Check out their "Do Something U" video, "How to Pitch Your Project," for tips, then upload your best pitch for a chance to win one of five \$250 grants given each month. 3) Do Something Club Grants: Grants help sustain official Do Something Clubs and their community social action projects. Five grants worth \$250 each month.

Global Green USA's Green School Makeover Competition

Date: September 30, 2011, submission deadline

Description: With budget deficits affecting school districts across the country, greening your school -- one of the quickest ways to save money (to the tune of thousands of dollars a year) -- is becoming a necessity. The non-profit Global Green USA is hosting a Green School Makeover Competition to "green" the winning school. Here's how it works: tell Global Green how you plan to green your school (make sure the principal and/or facilities manager signs off too) and follow the instructions for submitting an application any time from March 1- September 30, 2011.

Award: Grand prize is \$65,000 for school greening, plus an additional \$65,000 of in-kind technical assistance. Four additional schools will each receive \$2,500 towards their green school renovations.

CONTEST: Green Thumb Challenge

Date: September 30, 2011, entry deadline

Description: The Green Thumb Challenge from the Green Education Foundation (GEF) aims to connect children with nature and the healthy benefits of gardening. GEF provides schools and youth groups with beginner-friendly resources to plant gardens of any size, in addition to fun activities and standards-based lessons linking the classroom to the garden.

Award: All participants have the opportunity to be awarded a \$5,000 grant in recognition of their garden project.

Date: October 14, 2011, entry deadline

Description: This contest is a little different: rather than reward schools for past achievements, we want to reward schools that are just getting started and help you take action to green their schools. We'll select *two* schools where parents, school staff and students are starting a Green School program and have newly established a Green Team (within the last 12 months) with a compelling "Green Dream" that they hope to achieve.

Award: \$500, plus training and support from the Green Schools Initiative and environmentally-friendly prizes from our sponsors, like recycled paper notebooks from New Leaf Paper and Topflight, nutritious organic snacks from Clif Bar, and non-toxic hand soaps and sanitizers from CleanWell, among others.

Description: Like A Drop of Water's writing contest encourages youth ages 8-17 to share their ideas on how they and their countries can reduce climate change and pollution. Parents, grandparents and teachers are encouraged to

share their ideas with their young authors. Teachers and their students may submit a class essay as well as serve as judges. "Like drops of water that make up the oceans, millions of people of all ages, can lead the way to creating the positive changes we need to create a sustainable planet."

Award: 6 Awards of \$50-\$100 per month through June 2015. Each year the top fifty essays will be sent to the White House and made available to governments across the world. Bi-yearly, the one hundred winning essays will be published as an e-book for

world wide distribution.

National Public Lands Day (NPLD) is the nation's largest, single-day volunteer event for public lands in the United States. In 2011, NPLD will be held on September 24. NPLD began in 1994 with three sites and 700 volunteers. It proved to be a huge success and NPLD became a yearly tradi-

tion, typically held on the last Saturday in September. Since the first NPLD, the event has grown by leaps and bounds. Each year the PEYA program honors a wide variety of environmental projects developed by young individuals, school classes (kindergarten through high school) summer camps, public interest groups, and youth organizations to promote environmental awareness.
